The baits work by attracting slugs to eat the pasta particles and take in the iron, which disrupts a mollusc's ability to make slime. The bait is not a contact poison and doesn't work by toxicity.

*SPRAYING AMMONIA ON SOIL FOR SLUGS IS <u>ILLEGAL</u> & NOT SPECIFIC TO SLUGS



Many local gardeners also swear by placing beer in a tin or cup, above soil surface; slugs go for a sip and drown.

Keep it above to soil to save ground beetles, which eat slugs!
